

Fiscal Year 2012

Beginning in December 2011, the Parking Clerks' office added the option of paying tickets on line. This update has proven to be very popular. With the help of our software vendor NetTech, the process transfers funds directly to our financial institution and posts the payment to our software. A total of 182 tickets were paid from December 1st through June 30th.

Entering tickets in house is working out very well. During FY 2012 we recorded 12,522 tickets. 9,687 tickets were paid; \$291,526.00 in fines were collected for the towns.

At the request of the Town of Oak Bluffs Police Dept. and with the approval of the Board of Selectmen, the Parking Clerk's office purchased 2 hand-held computer ticketing and printing devices which the Oak Bluffs Police Dept. will use these for at least the next 3 seasons, June through October. During the first month 498 tickets were issued using the device.

Our online access to the Registry of Motor Vehicles database continues to enable us to assist those with parking ticket problems and/or questions immediately. It allows us to clear and mark tickets electronically. This real time updating continues to be a very important in helping those in non-renewal status.

Joseph Sollitto, Hearings Officer, is available at the Dukes County Courthouse, Monday through Friday, 8:30 to 10:30 for those wishing to protest tickets within 21 days. Written protests are accepted if procedures detailed on the front of tickets are followed.
